Death of the sixth Superior General: November 21

Father Albert BOURGEOIS (January 30, 1921 – November 21, 1992)





Fr. Albert Bourgeois. Sixth Superior General (June 6, 1967 - June 6, 1979), was born on January 30, 1921 in France. He made his first profession on September 29, 1938 and was ordained on July 6, 1947. Fr. Bourgeois was elected the sixth Superior General of our Congregation on June 6, 1967, and re-elected for a second six-year term on June 22, 1973. He ended his mandate on June 6, 1979, and died in Paris on November 21, 1992.

In the Life and Faith Experience of Father Dehon

It is quite clear that the presentation which our Rule of Life gives to the "life and faith experience of Father Dehon is succinct and reduced to the essentials. It does not dispense us from a more profound study of the sources which are more indispensable than ever if one wishes to communicate with this "experience" as we are invited to (n. 47), if one wishes also, as it is normal and desirable(if one wants)to communicate authentically with this "experience of Fr. Dehon" (n. 47), if one wants to judge the historical, psychological and spiritual truths of the themes which have been retained.

Whatever it is in itself, according to the Rule of Life, Jesus Christ for Fr. Dehon is in the first place an experience of faith and love, "a love of which he experienced the active presence in his own life". It is the experience of St. Paul according to the well-known text: "... the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God who loved me and gave himself up for me" (Gal 2,20).

In this experience Jesus Christ appeared as a loving person with a love proved by the gift of himself even to death for men being "the source of salvation for men", to the Father as "a filial obedience ".

Number 6 takes up these elements to describe the purpose of the Congregation: "The oblation of Christ to the Father for the salvation of men". The order "men-Father" is reversed here recovering the profound level and the hierarchy of the reason for the Passion, "so that the world may know that I loved the Father" (Jn 14,31).
